## MLA Style: FAQs for Works Cited

Here is the general format for a Works Cited page entry for a webpage:

### How to I make an entry for a webpage?

Author. "Title of source." Title of container, Publication Date, Location. Date of access.

Here is a sample entry for a webpage:

↓ **Webpage titles should be in quotation marks**

**Website titles ↑ should be in italics**
