Articles (or determiners) are used before nouns for clarity.

"The" is a definite article and refers to a particular item:

The studies, however, illustrated several health risks associated with artificial sweeteners (Dalton & Fool, 2010).

"The" refers to specific studies that are cited here.

"A/an" is an indefinite article and refers to any item within a group of possible items:

A study needs to be done on the effects of artificial sweeteners on adolescents.

"A" refers to any study that might be done in the future on this topic.
