

MLA Style: FAQs for Works Cited

How to I make an entry for a webpage?

Here is the general format for a Works Cited page entry for a webpage:

Author. "Title of source." *Title of container*, Publication Date, Location. Date of access.

Here is a sample entry for a webpage:

Bogost, Ian. "You Already Live in Quarantine: It's Never Been More Pleasant to be Holed up at Home." *The Atlantic*, 4 Mar. 2020, <https://www.theatlantic.com/technology/archive/2020/03/coronavirus-you-already-live-quarantine/607474/>. Accessed 4 Mar. 2020.

Webpage titles should be in quotation marks.

Website titles should be in italics.

Note the format of dates in MLA.

How do I cite interviews?

Here is a sample Works Cited page entry for a personal interview:

Smith, Patricia. Personal Interview. 2 Mar. 2020.

How do I create a hanging indent?

A hanging indent means the first line of each entry is aligned left while each subsequent line is indented. Use the process below to format your hanging indents.

1 Click on the arrow in the bottom, right-hand corner of the Paragraph Section of the Home tab.

2 In the Paragraph menu, under Special, select Hanging, and change the spacing to 0.5 inches.

3 Click OK.
